A biennial review which included an assessment of Wartburg Theological Seminary's drug and alcohol abuse prevention program was completed by Barb Simon, director for financial aid and student services. The review entailed reviewing the requirements of the Department of Education Regulations for the Drug and Alcohol Prevention Program and the Drug-free Workplace requirements and Wartburg's prevention program was deemed to be in compliance with these requirements. Wartburg's policy is outlined in the student and community life handbook, the staff handbook, and the faculty handbook. Having had zero (0) drug or alcohol related incidences since the last biennial review, Wartburg Theological Seminary's drug and alcohol abuse prevention program was deemed to be effective and only requiring updates to the posted drug and alcohol incident statistics and the Biennial Review report. These changes have been made.
