	Courses for "Youth Ministry Specialization" (Adv. Certificate in Youth & Family Ministry) should ideally be courses specifically identified as such, although in a pinch most Contextual Ministry courses can be adapted (with advanced communication between student and instructor) to meet this need through adjustments made by the course instructor through different assignments or readings for the particular student needing this requirement.

Part 2 – Courses taught through the Lutheran Seminary Program in the Southwest (Austin, TX) for the Certificate in Hispanic Ministry. Course numbers ending in 'A' are taught in English, whereas course numbers ending in 'H' are taught in Spanish. LSPS courses are taught less frequently than once a year, with the scheduling of offerings dependent on the cohort size (based primarily on the LSPS TEEM student population, and less so on the other certificate population), and will vary between English and Spanish versions based on the number of Spanish speakers available in the student body. [NOTE: All LSPS courses are currently taught as on-campus intensive courses only on the LSPS campus in Austin.]
